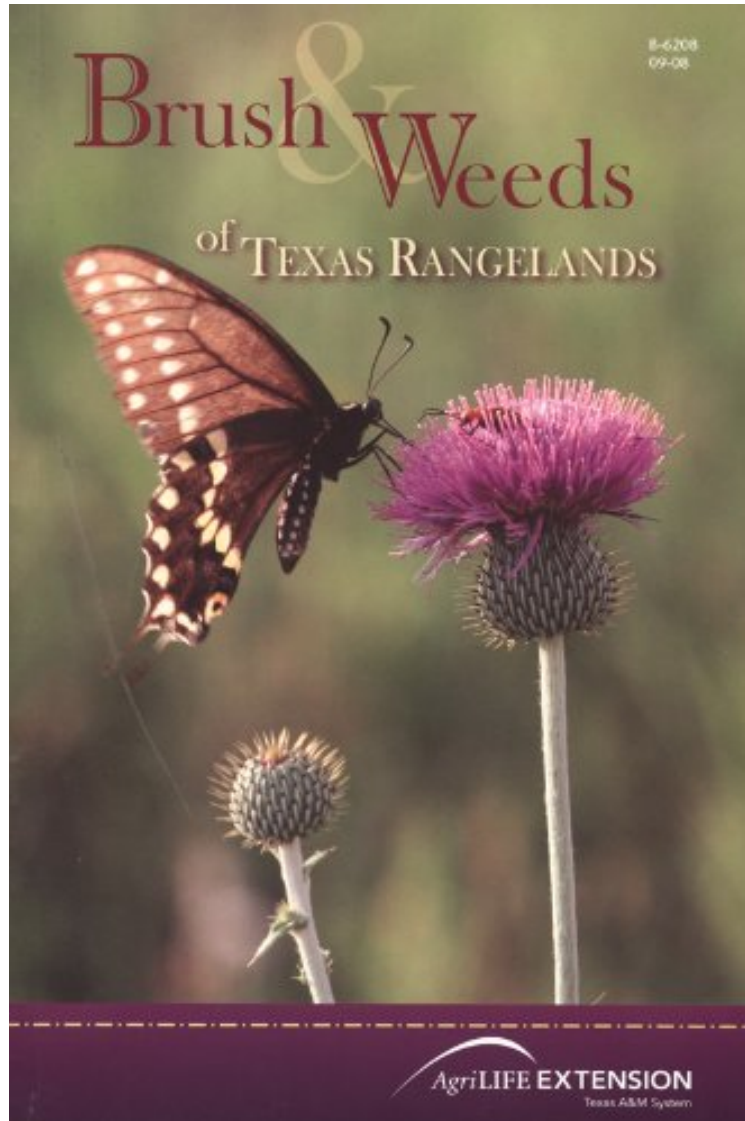

will help you figure out "What is it?". The book includes nice full color glossy photos on every other page. It details key features, growth habits, and use by wildlife and/or livestock. We are not talking about lengthy scholarly descriptions, this book is more about identification and basic information. We were particularly interested in the wildlife value of the various plants on our property, as that is something we want to maximize. We identified an aggressive invasive plant that provided no value to wildlife or livestock, and eradicated it. (We actually bought this book because we suspected it was such, but wanted confirmation).
