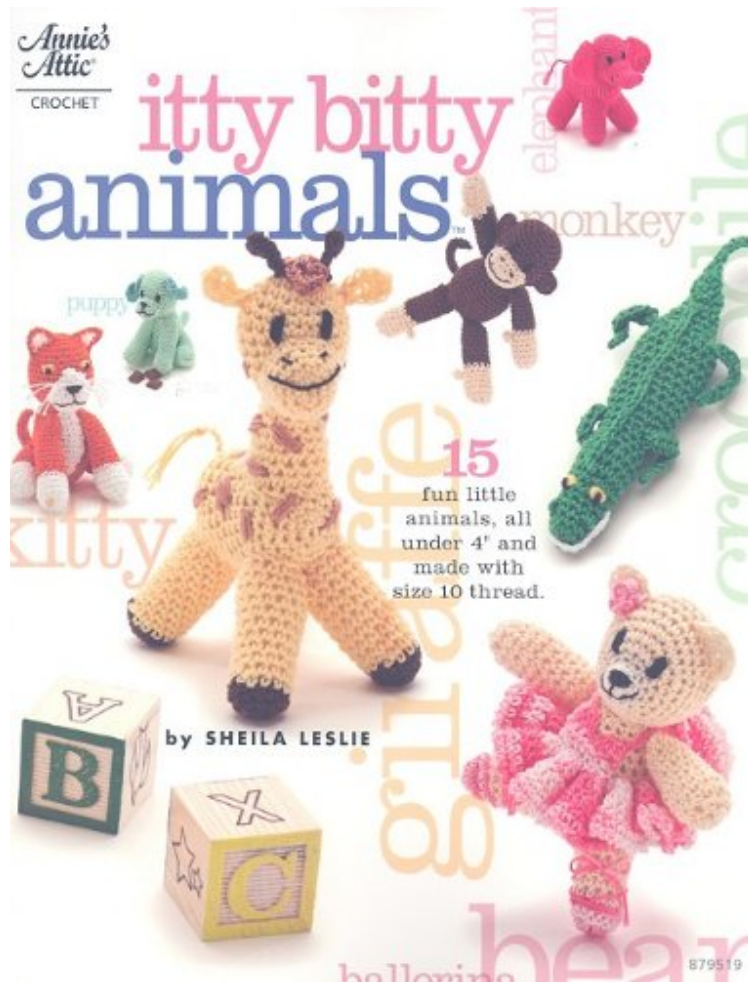

Certainly not a "learn to crochet" book. The majority of the color changes on the "animals" are simply embroidery floss - while the bears are much more details with seperately-crochet'ed clothing and details. The ballerina has a tutu, the baby bear has undies/bib/bottle, chef has a pizza/spoon/bib/hat, sam has hat/suspenders with color changes, and santa has a hat/shirt with color changes. Overall, this is an "ok" amigurumi book, with a strong lean towards the bears. If you want some nice amigurumi "teddy bear" patterns, you will like the patterns near the end of this book. If you want natural animals, there are some better choices.

The legs and tail of the alligator are a simple chain stitch that's flimsy, and there are better dog/cat patterns in other books, the reindeer could be a monkey if you took away his antlers, and the pig looks ridiculous on his far-too-big legs. The elephant pattern is cute, as is the monkey and bunny. It's not an instructional book, and because I was looking for itty bitty ANIMALS, not itty bitty TEDDY BEARS, I have to give this book 3 out of 5 stars. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
