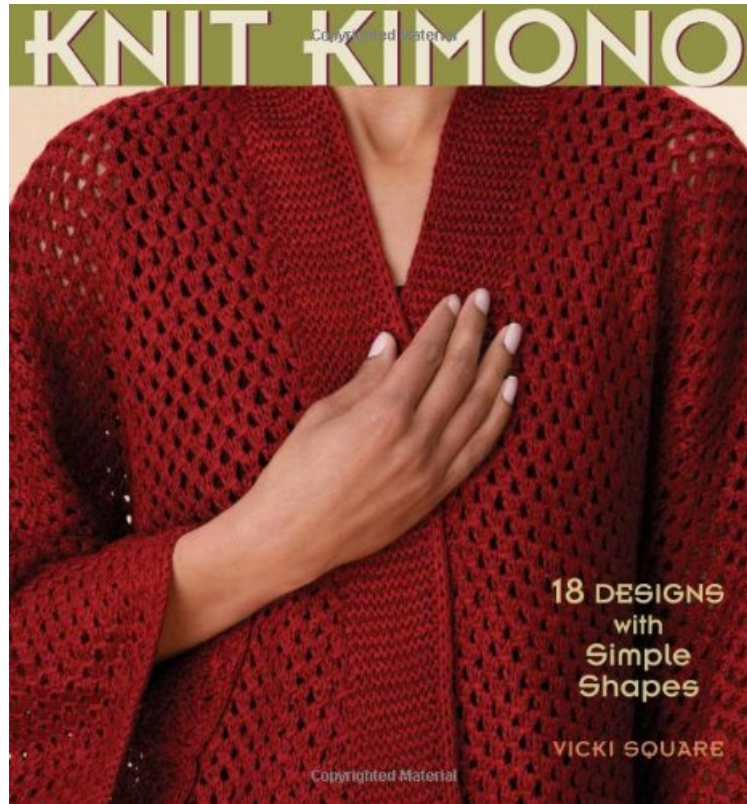

I am a fairly experienced knitter and I think that most of the projects are within the reach of average knitters. The projects are somewhat ambitious, in that most of them will require a lot of knitting (time, yarn), because they are big items, some of them ankle-length. However, they look cozy and comfortable and kimonos flatter every figure. If you want something comfy and yet stylish, and like holding knitting needles in your hands, go for it.I would have liked a bit more information on knitting techniques, which is why I didn't give this the full five stars.1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. The measurements are taken at the bust, rather than saying small, medium, large, but most are easy to adjust for larger sizes. If you don't mind working out the math, it's a great book. Don't forget to swatch first!
