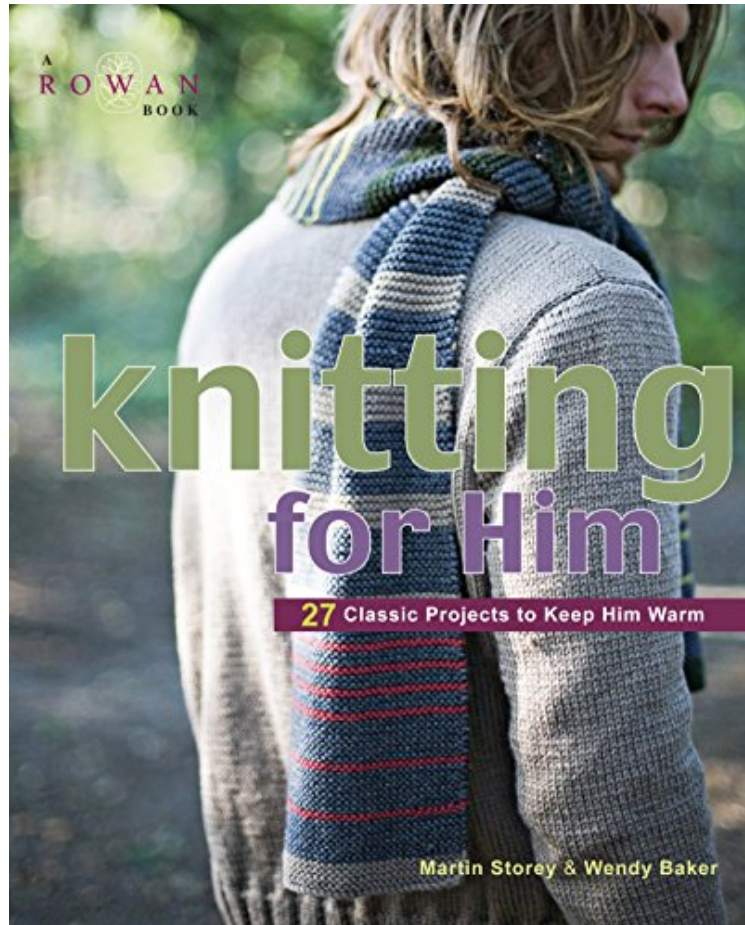

I was hoping to get a book that would be as good as Scarf Style with knits specifically for men. Unfortunately I found the patterns bit confusing. My main problem with this book is that there is a "knitting information" section with hardly any information on e.g. how to stitch seams or which increase/decrease to use on a pattern other than stockinette (and there is no information on this in the patterns either). A big problem is that even though there is a section that explains how to finish off the type of sleeve, and each pattern has a picture of the type of sleeve, there's no information indicating what type of sleeve is what. In other words, there are pictures in the patterns that don't tell you the type of sleeve, and explanations of the sleeve type in the "knitting information" section and no pictures at all. And there is missing cable instructions for the cabled v-neck pattern. I can't really say if these patterns are for advanced knitters but even if it

is, I think there should still be something in the book to guide those who feel they are ready to go into the world of sweater/cardigan knitting without completely confusing them. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
