This book needs revision to make it usableBy stormyI purchased the initial edition of this book because I wanted to learn more about different short row techniques and how to properly use these in garments. I was sadly disappointed. The book has major errors in it that even I could spot (for example, charts for two sizes are put on the wrong pages), and these errors make it almost unusable as a reference guide. The typographic and layout errors in this book made me wonder if it wasn't tech edited by someone who understands knitting, or if it was rushed to print without that step. I am afraid to make anything from it because I don't want to waste precious knitting time trying to re-write patterns and instructions. I do not recommend this book in its current form. If the book is revised, I will consider it again, but for now it's going back.0 of 0 people found the following

review helpful. As others have pointed out, there are indeed errors ...By Studio TAs others have pointed out, there are indeed errors in this book, which ruins it for me. Who dares put in the dozens of hours required for hand-knitting when faced with weak instructions? A few examples: The cardigan on page 35 seems to be missing the step for putting the right and left sides together. The top illustration on page 100 is missing the stitch marker. The stitch markers themselves are drawn as closed circles, when the directions call for removable markers. The light gray text on pages 5 and 140-143 is really hard to read. And so on. Other people (not I) are getting paid to catch and fix the problems, so I'll avert my eagle eyes and return the book for a refund.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. I found the illustrations and explanations of the various short-row techniques clear and fairly easy to understand. Maybe with more knitting experience I can tackle some of the more advanced patterns.
