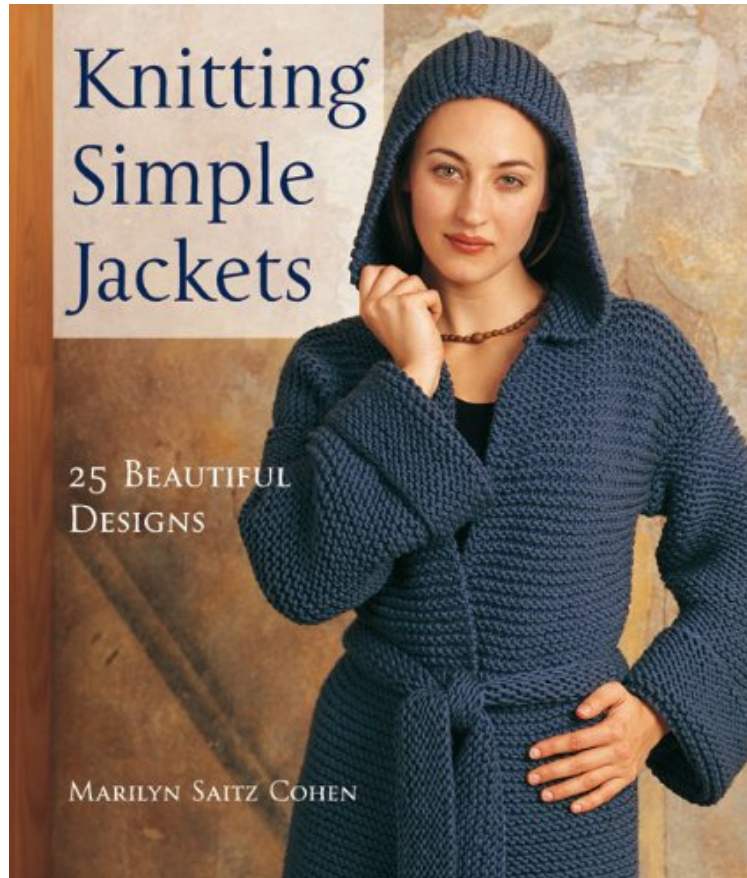

Good advanced beginner bookBy Carol T.While most of the patterns in this book are boxy designs, there is a nice selection of jackets suited to beginning knitters, who will feel a sense of accomplishment by making one of these. While most of these designs will be too simple for more advanced knitters, it is important that books like this, which provide nice patterns for clothing that's not too "crafty" looking (as so many beginning knitting books contain) are available because they provide incentive to beginners, who often quit because they have access to only ugly easy designs made of chunky yarn or the patterns are just too hard.For more advanced knitters there are a couple of designs that will have a little bit of challenge to them. There is one long lace jacket that's really beautiful and that I even as an advanced knitter will knit carefully. It has a repetitive pattern, which is good for an intermediate beginner (probably not the first one a new knitter should try but something to work toward).The other thing to mention is that once you are comfortable with the knitting level of this book, you can start to make changes to the designs, switch out recommended yarns for different yarns, etc. That's really when knitting gets fun.So overall, a nice book for beginners ready to graduate from scarves into the next phase.1 of 1 people found the following review

Many of the designs in this book are elegant yet simple to construct - I have not made any of them yet, but in reading through the patterns I know I will be able to follow them with no issue, in particular The Versatile Wrap and Elegant Kimono. Even though I am a woman "of a certain age", I have no desire to look like an old lady, so I am very happy with the designs - simple yet on trend and/or timeless. Every one - including a sporty Aran tweed coat, a fluffy white jacket and a cheerful yellow lightweight jacket for spring - can be completed in short order, thanks to the easy-to-follow instructions and well-thought-out designs. Colour photos of the finished garments capture their chic, contemporary style.

From Booklist Using classic shapes like the Chanel coat, Cohen has created a collection of versatile, stylish, easy-to-knit coat patterns that knitters will return to again and again. The patterns are simple--few are longer than two pages--with complete material lists and clear illustrations. The yarn used to knit the illustrations is provided in captions next to the photos, not in the material lists--a nice touch to encourage yarn choice. For easy reference, pattern stitches are listed at the beginning of each pattern. Cohen's passion for designing knitwear is clear from the care she takes in explaining her design process, the challenges she faced creating the patterns for the book, and the importance of yarn selection for a beautiful finished piece.
