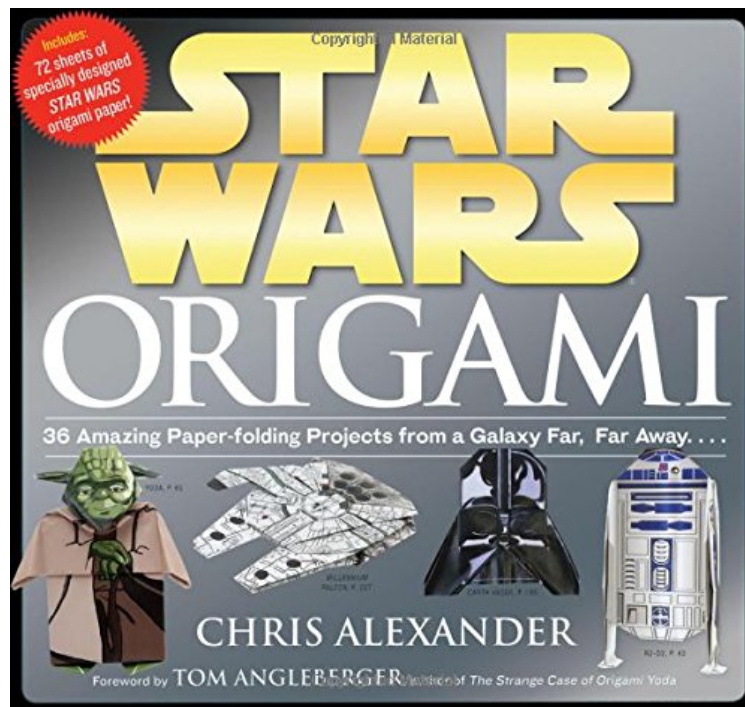

Fun!By TawnyFor the most part I've been loving the Star Wars Origami. At the beginning of the book the authors demonstrate how to do certain types of folds. For the rest of the book, it refers to those folds. For example, while folding Chewbacca, it just tells you to do this fold on a certain part. For the most part this is fine and followed easily enough, but there are times when just instructing "sink fold" is not enough. I would then go back and review the sink fold, but honestly was not able to see how that fit to a certain step I was on. That's a bit frustrating. Kids love origami and what could be cooler than transforming a piece of paper into Boba Fett, Princess Leia, Yoda, or R2-D2? And not just any paper, but custom-designed paper illustrated with art from the movies. *Star Wars Origami* marries the fun of paper folding with the obsession of Star Wars. Like *The Joy of Origami* and *Origami on the Go*, this book puts an original spin on an ancient art. And like *Star Wars Scanimation* and *Star Wars Fandex*, it's a fresh take on Star Wars mania. Chris Alexander is a master folder and founder of the popular website StarWarsOrigami.com, and here are 36 models, clearly explained, that range in difficulty from Youngling (easy) to Padawan (medium), Jedi Knight (difficult), and Jedi Master (tricky!). A front section introduces origami definitions and basic folds. Bound in the back is the book's unique folding paper, two sheets for each figure. Illustrated with original art, it makes each creation the essential lightsabers, the Death Star, and much more true to the movies. *Star Wars Origami* includes a foreword by Tom Angleberger, author of the New York Times bestsellers *The Strange Case of Origami Yoda* and *Darth Paper Strikes Back*, and is scheduled to be published at the same time as Angleberger's upcoming book, *The Secret of the Fortune Wookiee*.
