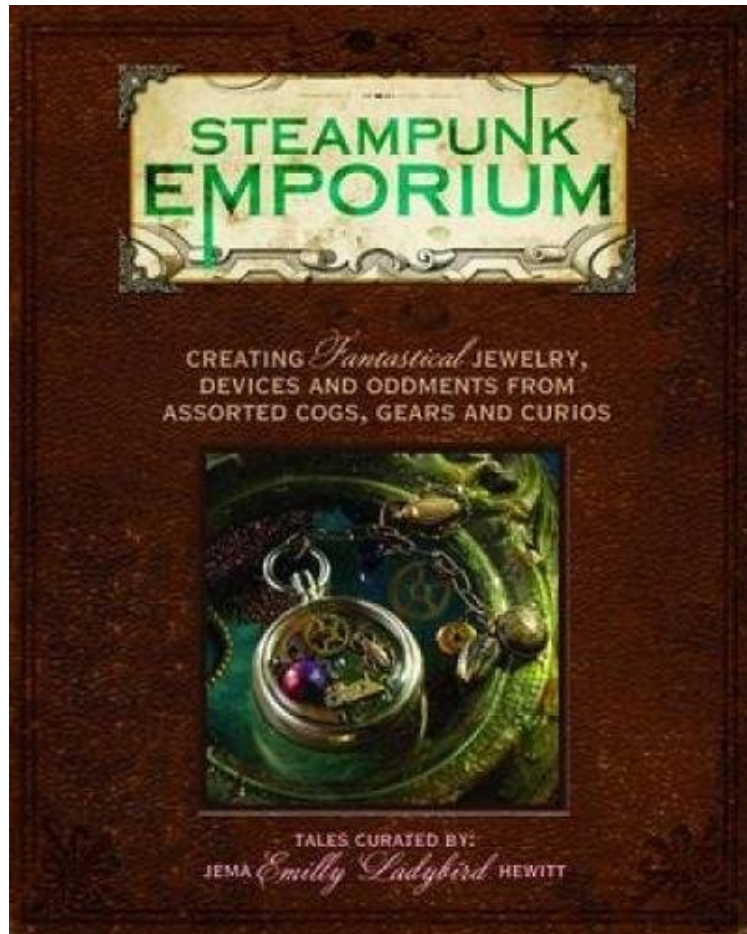

For example her Absinthe Fairy necklace gives clear directions for faux vitrail work, (like stained glass, but with enamel), and a method that makes it dead simple at home! (I was so pleased that it worked so well.) This is a book that can take you from beginner to producing some really lovely pieces. Perhaps the only drawback of the book is that we must now wait with baited breath and great anticipation for its sequel, which I hope that Ms. Ladybird is in the process of preparing.
