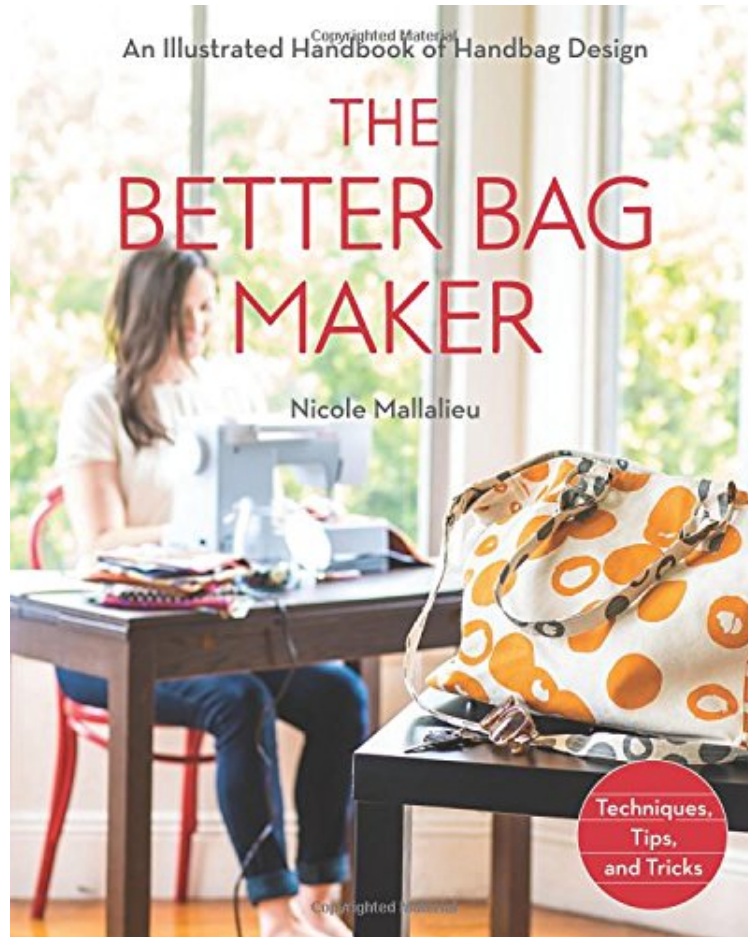

This book is loaded with the techniques and tricks to take your bag-making over the top, with ways to take a simple design and change it over and over to make each bag something special and unique. I'm most excited by the various handle and strap construction tips she provides. I'll be using these techniques over and over, on bags from most any designer I have patterns from.

By Customer I am teaching myself to make handbags and the book has helped me tremendously to understand and complete the construction of very nice details of a good bag. The only problems I have had is using fusing tape in making the gussets because it later gums up the needle of my machine. This was probably a learning-curve issue for me and the tape should not be sewn over. Otherwise, the techniques have been fairly easy to execute and adapt. The book is laid out nicely with lots of tips and pictures. Some pictures would be more clear if there was contrasting thread and cloth, but, still, a person can "play" with the project and come up with the outcome that is shown in the photo. I am planning to make more of the bags that are pictured in this book.

The first third of Mallalieu's book focuses on step-by-step tutorials for techniques specific to sewing bags, such as choosing interfacing, preparing and attaching pockets (including zippered pockets), and attaching hardware such as snaps, clasps, purse feet, and strap rings. These lessons are followed by a basic tote pattern with detailed instructions, placing the techniques within the context of an actual bag pattern and allowing novices to build confidence. The other ten designs feature a variety of styles, from chic overnight bags to a stylish satchel to a convertible backpack-tote, and all of the patterns expand on the skills and methods covered at the beginning of the book. Pattern sheets are included. **VERDICT** While these plans are useful, the technique tutorials are the highlight here; they contain information that can be applied to many bag patterns, not just the ones in this collection.
